Whether you've joined us this year or have been following along since our start in 2011, you know the OWLS organization and the communities we serve have been through a lot together. From our launch to the pandemic to the unprecedented growth and impact we achieved this past school year, we can proudly state three things:

#1. We are relationship-powered.

Relationships shape our future just as much as they shape who we are as people and as a community. We know that everything we do at OWLS—from coaching lacrosse and academic advancement to enhancing social-emotional learning outcomes and providing life-altering experiences—starts with the vital connections we make. This is especially true for the nurturing presence of trained OWLS coaches, mentors, and educators as they work with students and families along an often tumultuous educational journey.

Thanks to your generous support, we were able to support our community school partners with full-time program officers—and give these critical relationships the focus, energy, empathy, support, and positive outcomes they all deserve. The results, as you'll see, speak for themselves!

#2. We are impact-driven.

For many of our participants, lacrosse is about competing and having fun. While they play the game, OWLS is playing a key role in helping student-athletes make healthy choices in unpredictable environments. This is most evident in our OWLS Academy, where our aspiring scholars hone the skills and receive guidance necessary to attend the high school of their choice—and have success when they arrive.

As you'll see in this year's Impact Report, our most successful OWLS Scholars have been with us since elementary school, proving that the more hours we can invest in our students, the more opportunities they will have to be successful. **And we clocked almost 4,000 hours of programming this year.**

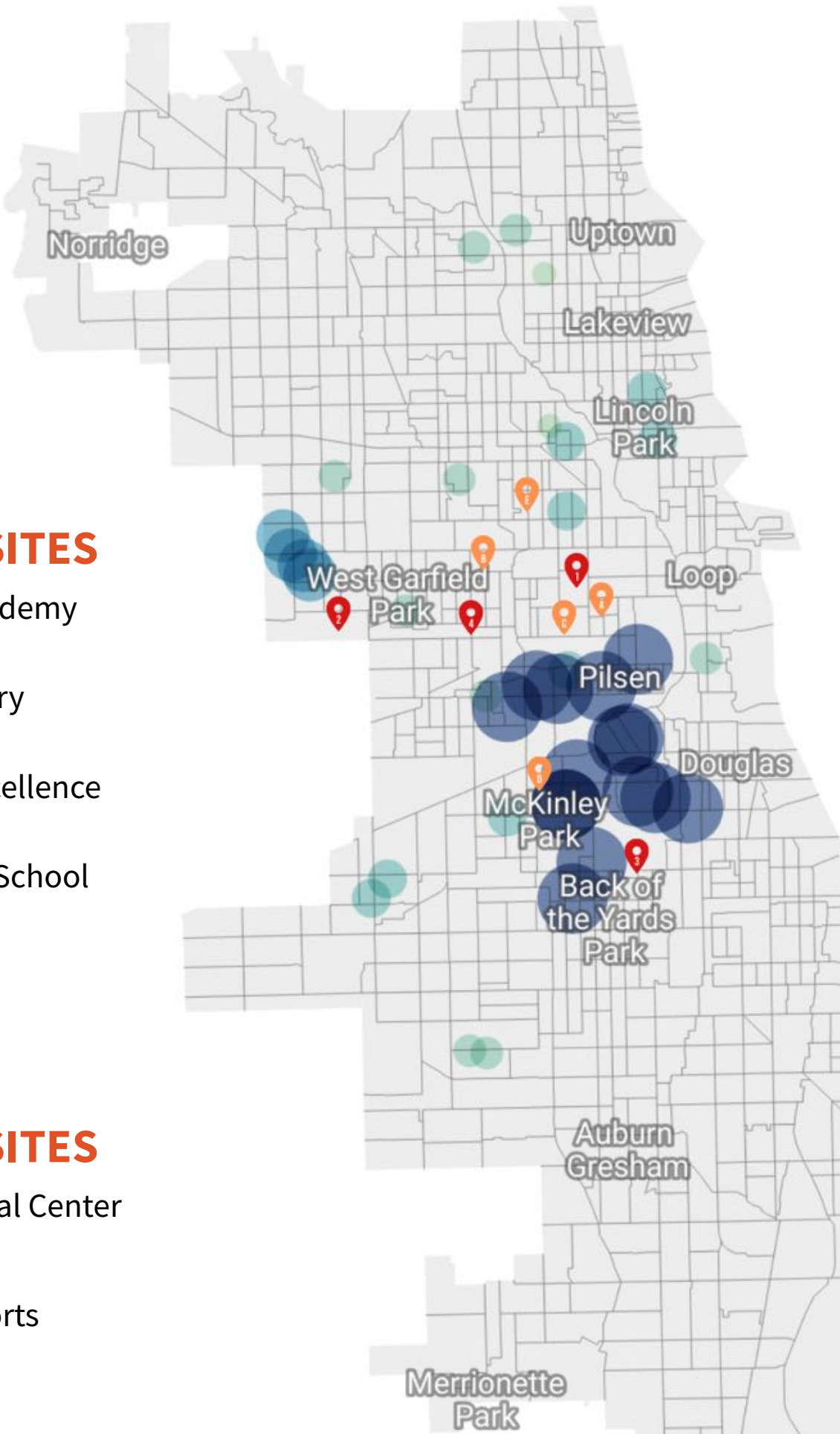

Outreach GRADES 3-5

Each year, OWLS Outreach programs introduce the game of lacrosse to hundreds of Chicago kids.

OWLS Outreach is the entry point into our programming and gives elementary-age students the opportunity to learn and play lacrosse for the first time.

We focus on the development of basic movement skills like running, jumping, landing, kicking, scooping, throwing, and catching in a fun setting.

Built around informal play and positive reinforcement, this is where we cover the fundamentals of lacrosse, build meaningful relationships, and lay the foundation for a lifetime of learning, healthy choices, and self-confidence.

For more than a decade, OWLS has partnered with Notre Dame's #PlayingforPeace, a student-led initiative that uses the platform of sport to bring people together in the pursuit of peace, justice, and human understanding.

This year, we hosted the ND lacrosse team at St. Malachy School for a "Power of Play Day," where @ndlacrosse supported our outreach programs, classroom activities and a big-time school clean-up!

The Fighting Irish went on to win the Division 1 National Championship the following May!



Youth League GRADES 4-8

The OWLS Youth League embeds competitive interscholastic lacrosse play with academic enrichment, social-emotional growth, and team-building experiences.

Building on community partnerships forged through our Outreach Program, the Youth League Program establishes lacrosse as an integral part of our participants' general health and wellness, while embedding this community sport within our partner schools and organizations.

Every OWLS student-athlete receives access to required equipment, safety training, coaching, and character-building opportunities —so they show up strong to each and every game.

GRADES 6-12

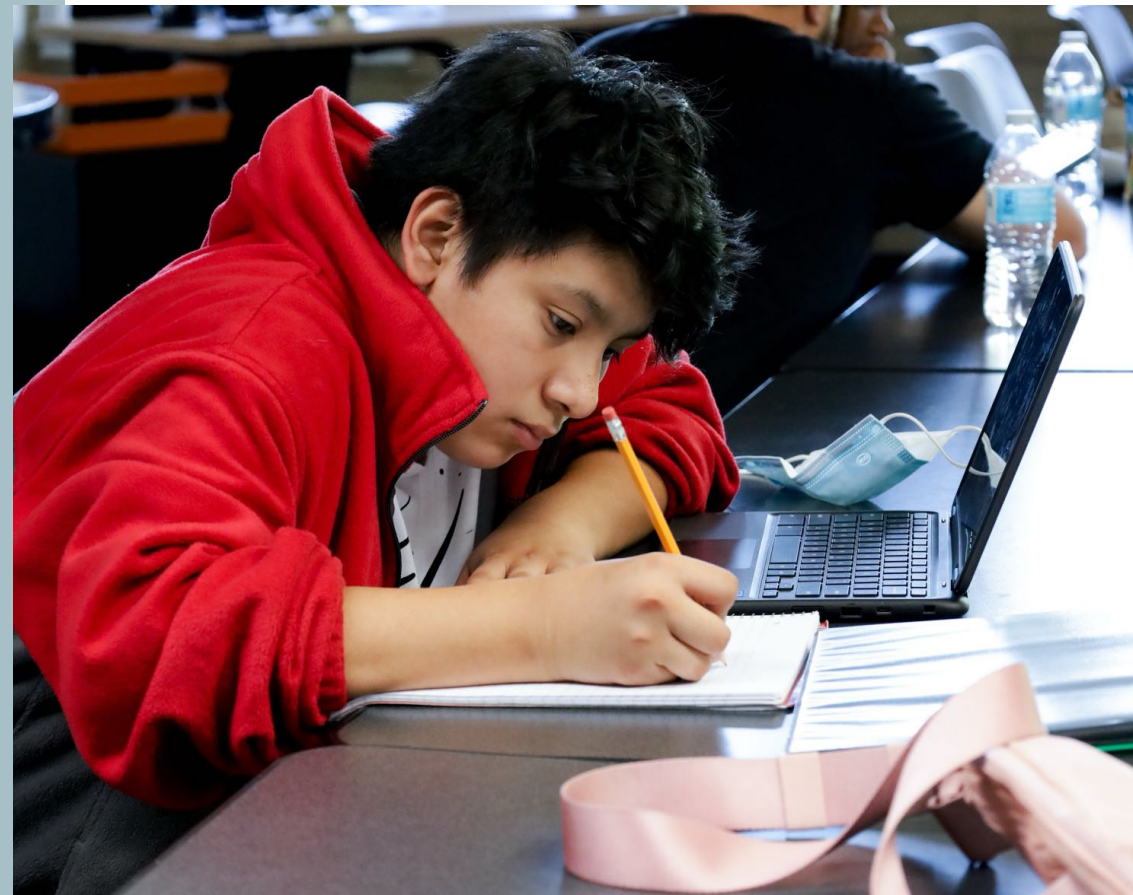


OWLS Academy is an intensive, year-round, holistic intervention program for our most active participants.

In addition to enhanced lacrosse experiences, **your donation provides OWLS Academy Scholars with ongoing academic support, career mentoring, enrichment programming, and a platform to discuss social justice.** This is where OWLS Academy Scholars develop skills that will help them succeed both on and off the field.

- **Academic and Life Enrichment**
Academic and experiential learning workshops, study tables, enrichment trips, and test prep programs.
- **Outcome Enhancement**
Consistent and intentional mentorship, subject-based tutoring, career exploration, service learning, and competitive lacrosse experiences.
- **Academic Access + Career Exploration**
Scholars receive access to competitive college-prep high schools, colleges, and professional networking spaces.

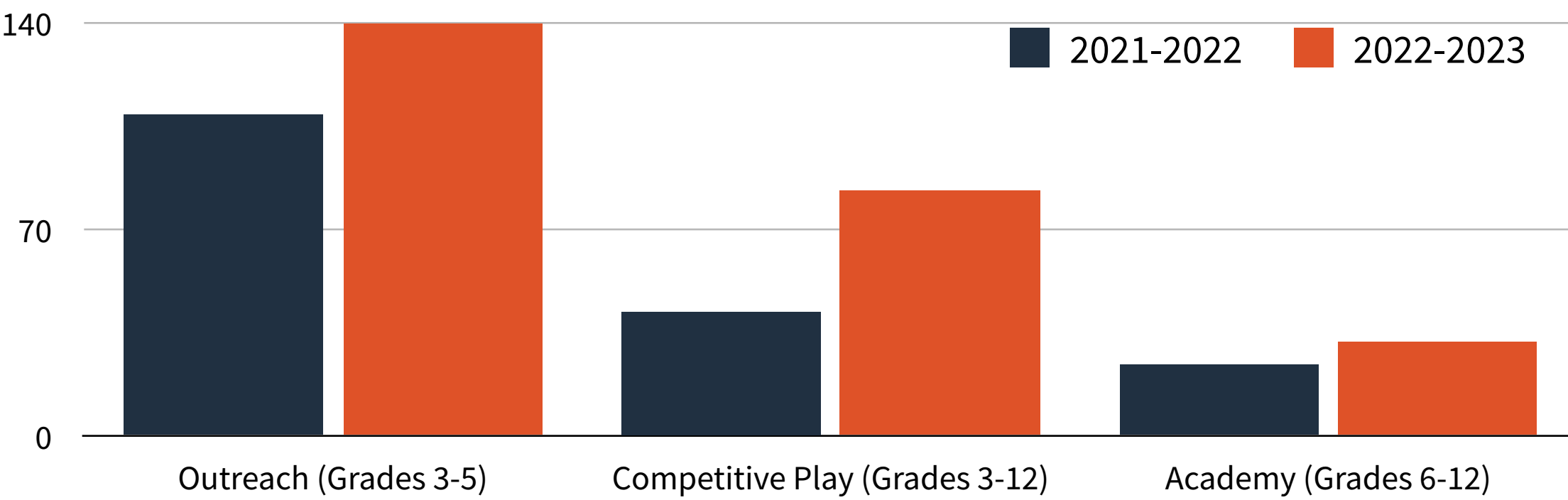
Armario “Mario” Hill, Jr.

The Year Ahead

GOALS FOR 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR

WHAT WE KNOW

- **Enrichment programs like ours are critical for youth development.** For us to accomplish our mission, students need to be seen, challenged, and supported physically, mentally, socially, and emotionally.
- **Resources are extremely limited in the historically marginalized communities we serve.** By understanding the needs of our school partnerships, we can better identify opportunities and gaps—and work together to address them.
- **Individual relationships matter.** From our student-athletes to school partnerships, community engagement, and organizational culture—the more time and touchpoints we can invest in our relationships, the better our retention numbers, student outcomes, and impact become.



OUR FOCUS FOR 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR

Optimizing Participation Through Exceptional Program Delivery

Our strategic plan emphasizes the following priorities for the next three years.

1 **Strive to set a high standard for sports-based youth development programs by defining and refining organizational roles, processes, curriculum, and impact tracking.**

2023 - 2024 GOAL:

Strengthen our structure by building our team with the hiring of a Communication Manager, Bookkeeper, and Program Coordinator.

2 **Create a scalable programming model to deepen our impact in Chicago—and wherever OWLS can change lives.**

2023 - 2024 GOAL:

To build our program at scale, we need quantifiable proof of success. Our working targets this school year include the following:

- 85% of all Youth League participants succeed in the area of social and emotional learning (SEL) via the pre/post Hello Insight Survey. Students with SEL skills are more college- and career-ready, experience better mental health and social functioning, and report a greater sense of well-being.
- 50% of all Academy Scholar Outreach participants participate in OWLS Spring League.
- Launch “Junior Academy” Programming at two partner schools that will provide engaged Outreach participants in 6th through 8th grade with on-site academic enrichment programming.

3 **Build an unstoppable OWLS community by way of our students, alumni, staff, board, donors, and community/corporate partners.**

2023-2024 GOAL:

Diversify our boards to reflect the communities we serve, increase awareness of the OWLS mission throughout the Chicago area, and foster new and high-impact partnerships with community and corporate partners.

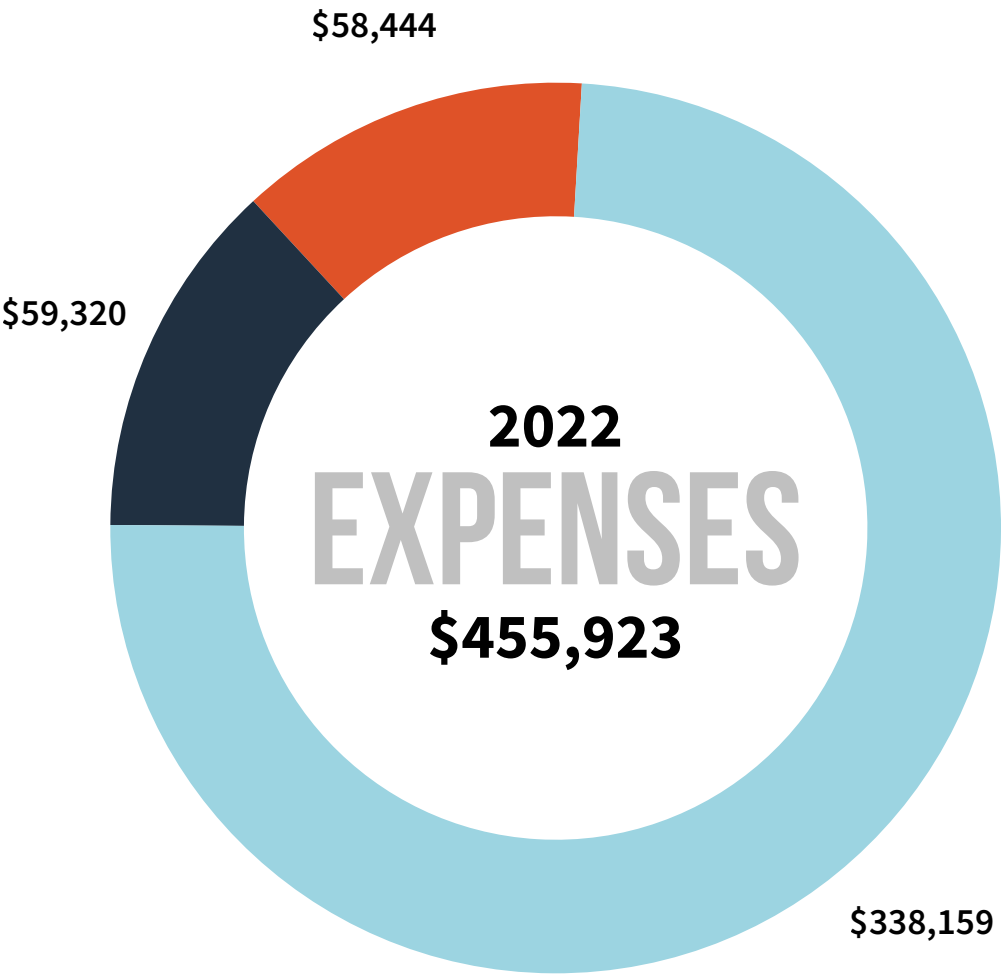
BENCHMARKS AND GOALS

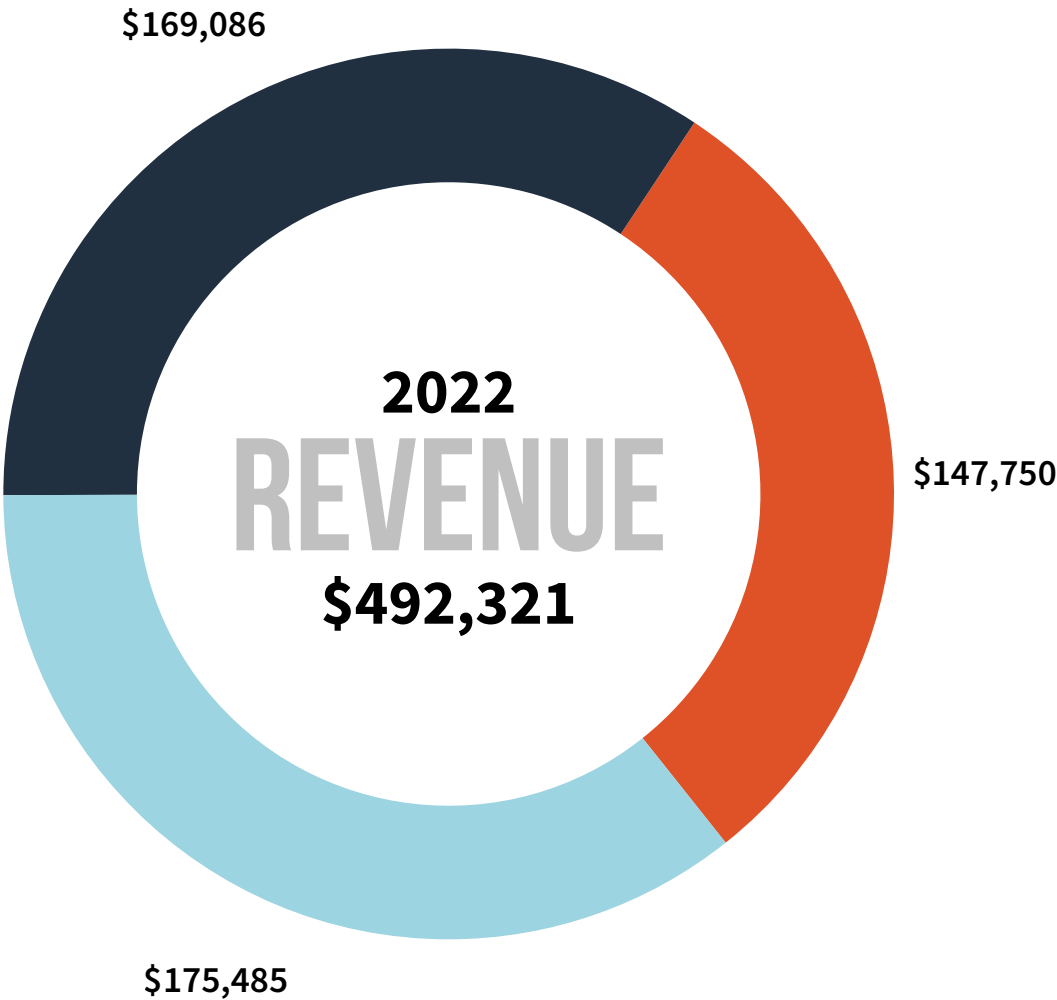
